

## **Applicant Information | Letter of Interest**

Prospective applicants in the Region 3 footprint are encouraged submit a *Letter of Interest* to provide basic project concepts which communicate your project concept to Council Staff for feedback and guidance prior to submitting a full application. Applicants submitting a *Letter of Interest* should keep in mind the GO Virginia program goals:

- Project that lead to higher-paying jobs.
- Scalable approaches that will spur regional economic growth.
- Improved capacity to respond to regional economic development priorities.
- Increased collaboration from a broad and diverse contingent of stakeholders.

**Letters of Interest** are concept papers that encourage stakeholders to begin collaborating on project ideas that align with the Areas of Critical Need that are identified in the Region 3 Growth & Diversification Plan. The *Letter of Interest* should be **no more than 2 pages of standard-size business paper**, and should include the following information:

- 1. Name, organization, address, phone and email for point of contact
- 2. Narrative description of proposed project including intended outcomes over first 2 years
- 3. List of (potential or identified) partners (names, organizations)
- 4. List of 2 or more localities likely (or committed) to participate
- 5. Statement of alignment with any of Region 3 Growth & Diversification Plan's Critical Areas of Focus:
  - a. Workforce Talent Development and Recruitment
  - b. Sectoral Development
  - c. Cyber Infrastructure
- Project Budget estimate (total budget, anticipated sources of funding including GO Virginia funding as well as other sources)
