Financial Reports & Project Update

Bryan David and Deborah Gosney presented the Financial Reports and Project Updates that were included in the meeting packet for the period ending November 30, 2024. Randy Lail made a motion that the Financial Reports be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Tim Clark and approved unanimously by roll call vote.

OLD BUSINESS

Project Pipeline

Bryan David reviewed the current project pipeline which was emailed to Council members prior to the meeting. The following projects were discussed:

- Institute for Advance Learning & Research (IALR) Virginia Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA) Hub: This is an implementation project for the CEA Strategy & Roadmap.
- SOVA Innovation Labs- Digital Fabrication Lab: This is an expansion of the SOVA Innovation Hub and will offer a maker's space and co-working space in a campus style environment.
- Southside Virginia Community College Foundation: This project will fund the training equipment (tractor trailers), technology equipment, and classroom furniture for the spaces serving the Powerline and Truck Driver Training Programs.
- Region 3 Leadership Development Project: This project would be in partnership with the UVA Sorenson Institute for Leadership and the Virginia Institute for Government to develop a community leadership program in Region 3.

Chair Willis asked members for questions or comments; there being none, there was no discussion regarding the updates.

NEW BUSINESS

The Artificial Intelligence (AI) Statewide Assessment is a collaborative, multi-region planning project in partnership with the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and GOVA Region 2. GOVA funding will support a consultant to produce a comprehensive AI report to include a sector-specific analysis, current program catalog, along with strategic recommendations. This report will identify how AI will impact the workplace from a business perspective, which will be included in the Virginia Chamber of Commerce's Blueprint 2035 update. Randy Lail made a motion to approve the AI Statewide Assessment application as presented; the motion was seconded by Tim Clark and approved unanimously by roll call vote.

PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Bryan David presented the Program Director's Report as detailed in the meeting packet. The topics discussed were a proposed amendment to the G&D Plan to add Logistics as a target sector, the IALR Talent Pathway Initiative, the status of the G&D Plan update, GOVA Regional Council Committee report, JLARC's report on data centers in Virginia, and the Tobacco Commission's Strategic Plan. There were no questions nor comments from the Council.

RE: Project Pipeline Report

Below is information about projects that are in varying stages of development:

I. SOVA Fab Lab

-the SOVA Innovation Hub plans to expand its SOVA Innovation Campus in South Boston. This expansion involves adaptively reusing a structure adjacent to its existing building with funding from the Mid-Atlantic Broadband Community Corporation (MBC) and the Tobacco Commission. A US Economic Development grant for the redevelopment of the building is not being pursued because the bid cost for the grant design was over the amount awarded. The project was rescoped to align with the Tobacco Commission grant and supplemental resources being provided by MBC.

- -a Region 3 Per Capita application is under development and tentatively scheduled to be submitted to the Region 3 Council for review and approval at its meeting on April 16. 2025. This will be followed by submission to DHCD GO Virginia staff and the GO Virginia State Board for review and approval at its June 10, 2025, meeting.
- -the SOVA Fab Lab will foster innovation, entrepreneurship, and workforce development in Halifax County and surrounding localities within a one-hour drive. It will equip individuals, businesses, and communities with innovation tools, training, and resources in an approximately 2,000 sq. ft. space.
- -a Fab Lab provides users access and training to use 3D printers and scanners, laser cutters, CNC machines, computers, software, and other related equipment.
- -the SOVA Fab Lab is engaging the <u>Fab Lab Foundation</u> as an experienced consultant for equipment acquisition, space layout, training, operations, and other GO Virginia grant-related matters. The Fab Lab Foundation will continue its consulting engagement once the space is operating.
- -the project will request \$500k from GO Virgina Region 3 Per Capita funds. The SOVA Fab Lab will use cash and in-kind matching funds from MBC and a Microsoft TechSpark grant to support the salary for a Fab Lab Manager, the upfit of the lab space, and other related operational expenses.
- -the total working project budget is approximately \$750k.

II. Southside Virginia Community College Foundation

-the Southside Virginia Community College Foundation, on behalf of SVCC, has secured a US EDA and Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission grants to construct a new building at its Blackstone/Fort Barfoot location to expand the successful Powerline Worker and Truck Driver Training programs due to increasing student and business demands. The design of the building is underway and should be completed in late Spring 2025.

-the EDA and Tobacco Commission funding will support the construction of a 6,000+ SF Power Line Worker Training School on an existing 4.82-acre lot at the Blackstone campus of Southside Virginia Community College (SVCC). In addition, the existing truck driver training range will be enlarged to facilitate an increase in the number of students to be served.

-GO Virginia Region 3 Per Capita funding will be used for technology needs for the newly constructed building and classroom and office furniture. Additionally, two (2) tractor/trailers will be acquired to allow for increased truck driver training. The total GO Virginia grant will be \$565,921.00. This equipment will serve the Powerline and Truck Driver Training Programs.

-the Region 3 Growth & Diversification plan was amended at the Region 3 Council meeting on January 15th to include Logistics and Transportation as a target business sector.

III. SOVA Partnership Health Science Careers

-the Talent Pathways Initiative planning project is being completed by project principals Blue Ridge Partnership for Health Science Careers (C. Lawrence) and George Mason University (Dr. C. Sutter). Dr. Julie Brown (IALR) has provided inregion leadership and staffing support to the SOVA Partnership.

-initial discussions with Dr. Brown focus on a GO Virginia Region 3 Per Capita grant application being submitted for consideration by the Region 3 Council at its January 2026 meeting. IALR would submit this application in partnership with the Region 3 healthcare systems (SOVA Health, Sentara, VCU Community Memorial Health, and Centra), the region's K-16 educational institutions, and other healthcare workforce development stakeholders.

-the grant would include funding for a minimum of one (1) staff position to support the SOVA Partnership's work, data collection and support, and other workforce

development deliverables. The position would be managed and supported by Dr. Brown and IALR.

-an initial estimate for a Per Capita grant is \$500k-\$750k

IV. Industrial Skilled Trades Training Program

-each of the community colleges (Patrick & Henry CC, Danville CC, and Southside Virginia CC) in GO VA Region 3 established a collaborative partnership in October 2024 to advance training and credentials in skilled trades. This partnership is being supported by a \$1MM grant from Chancellor Dore at the Virginia Community College System

-after discussing how GO Virginia Region 3 could support the partnership with Patrick & Henry Community College leadership, the college has begun exploring the feasibility of creating a workforce development training program for "industrial skilled trades." These trades would focus on supporting Region 3 targeted sectors and may include electrical, HVAC, carpentry, plumbing/pipefitting, and other trades related to the target sectors.

-the development of a Per Capita application has not yet been initiated.

RE: GO Virginia Region 3 Nominating Committee Report

As previously communicated to the Region 3 Council, the Nominating Committee will develop a recommendation on current members who are interested and eligible for reappointment and for new members to be appointed to replace those current members who are no longer eligible for reappointment. These member reappointments and appointments will be finalized at the Region 3 Council's meeting on July 16th.

The Region 3 Council meeting will hold the annual organizational meeting at its meeting on April 16th. At this meeting, the Region 3 Council approves the Chair and Vice Chair for 2025-2026.

The Region 3 Council bylaws specify that "...the council must be chaired by a citizen member from the region with significant private-sector business experience." It has been customary for the Vice Chair to have a similar experience. The Nominating Committee has under consideration a transition plan for the Chair and Vice Chair positions for 2025-2026 available to Region 3 Council in light of this requirement.

The current Chair (Lauren Willis) and Vice Chair (Randy Lail) will need to step down as Council members and from their Chair and Vice Chair roles effective July 1st because they are no longer eligible for reappointment. To ensure Region 3 Council leadership continuity, Lauren and Randy have expressed a willingness to remain as Chair and Vice Chair until June 30, 2026.

This extension would allow them time to assess current Region 3 Council members for private-sector individuals who may be interested and well-suited to move into leadership roles for the Region 3 Council. The bylaws allow members to serve until the council makes a replacement appointment.

It is my understanding that the other GO Virginia Region 3 Councils are undergoing similar transitions with founding members, and each has used appropriate and reasonable approaches to provide continuity for the organization during this time.

I have attached an updated roster for the Region 3 Council membership, which shows which members are eligible for reappointment and those who are no longer eligible for reappointment.

The Nominating Committee will be prepared to discuss this matter with the Executive Committee at the March 19th meeting.

RE: Pending Projects Report

The following pending project has received state GO Virginia approval:

<u>Virginia Chamber of Commerce – Artificial Intelligence Statewide Landscape</u>
 Assessment

-the project explores how artificial intelligence (AI) will transform Virginia's business landscape and workforce, specifically GO Virginia's target sectors of statewide significance. It will be a distinct workforce development element under VACC's Blueprint Virginia 2035.

-it will be led by a qualified consultant retained by the Virginia Chamber of Commerce Foundation. The consultant will conduct a statewide assessment to determine Al's anticipated impacts on the workforce in specific high-priority business sectors present in each of GO Virginia's nine (9) regions to include Advanced Manufacturing, Information and Emerging Technologies, and Life and Health Sciences/Biotechnology.

-GO Virginia Region 3 and GO Virginia Region 2 jointly contribute \$50k from each's Per Capita funds. The total project budget is \$150k, with \$50k representing an in-kind match from the VACC for its development and distribution of Blueprint Virginia 2035 and the estimated time value of the 36 representatives serving on the Project Workgroup.

-the application was submitted to DHCD GO Virginia staff for administrative approval on 12.18.24. After considerable review and responding to staff questions, DHCD's Director approved the project on 3.3.25. VACC and GO Virginia Regions 3 and 2 staff are finalizing the contract with DHCD. Once signed, VACC has identified qualified consultants interested in undertaking the project.

-the project is targeted for completion by September 2025.

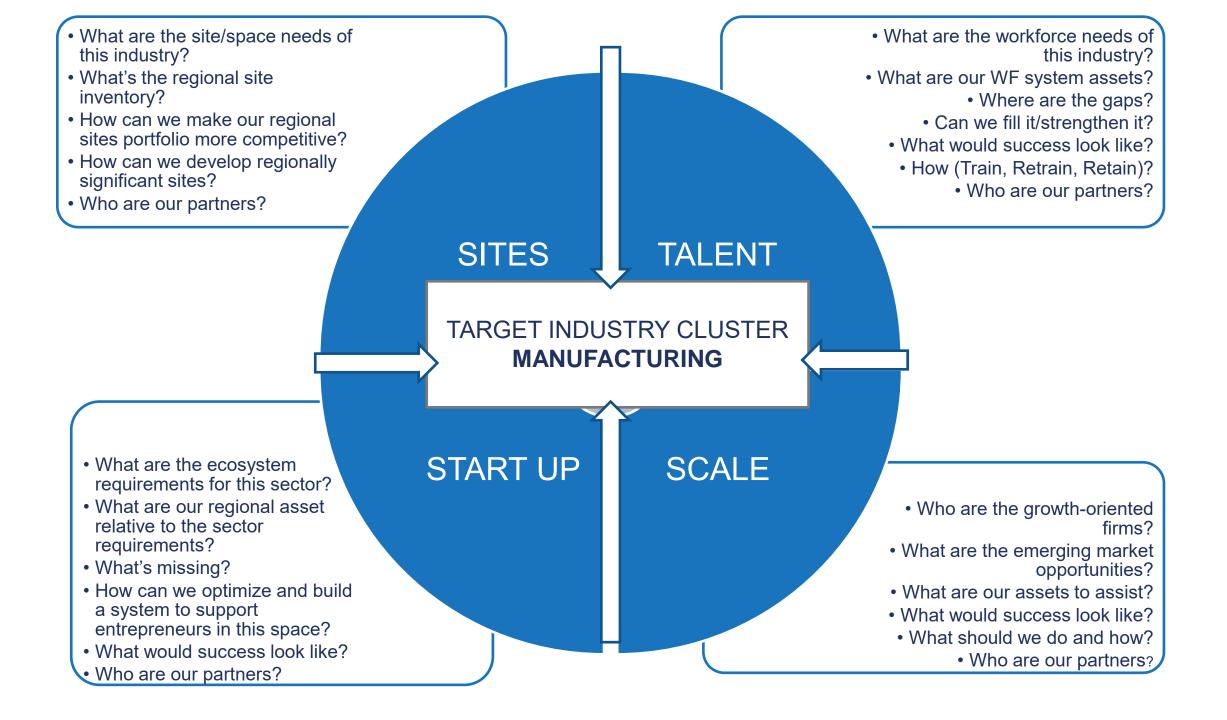

VEDP IS TRACKING AI-RELATED TRENDS AND OPPORTUNITIES TO DRIVE ECONOMIC GROWTH

VEDP is tracking trends in Artificial Intelligence, including Virginia's national standing related to Al labor demand

- Virginia has established itself as a national leader in Artificial Intelligence labor demand, keeping pace with much larger states (ranking #3 nationally in 2023)
- Al skills are now 50x more likely to appear in Virginia jobs postings, compared to 2014

Sector teams are conducting ongoing corporate engagement with core sector firms to understand how they are leveraging Al

- Increased AI integration for business and financial service companies is expected to reduce costs and streamline operations
- Continued integration will occur between cybersecurity and AI to protect AI-generated information for data security and from adversarial attacks

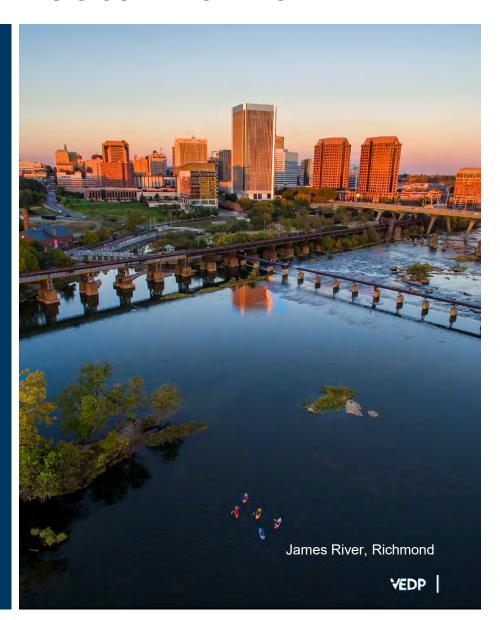
Ongoing VEDP efforts to support AI in Virginia include:

- Understanding AI from a talent alignment standpoint
- Marketing the Commonwealth as an innovation hub and leader in AI (Virginia Economic Review, Q3 2024)
- Tracking and supporting federal grant opportunities related to AI (i.e., National Science Foundation ExLENT program)



VEDP AND GO VIRGINIA HAVE OPPORTUNITIES FOR CONTINUED TACTICAL AND STRATEGIC COLLABORATION

- Increase dialogue and continue collaboration around specific initiatives and active projects
 - Office market strategy support and identification of funding opportunities (Knowledge Work)

- Potential collaboration around new Top State for Talent strategy
- Strategic planning
 - Update of the Strategic Plan for Economic Development in the Commonwealth (FY26)
 - Governor's Comprehensive Economic Development Policy (FY26-27)
