Approval of Minutes

Chair Willis noted that the minutes of the September 18, 2024 Executive Committee meeting were received via email prior to the meeting and included in the meeting packet. Melody Foster made a motion that the minutes from the October 16, 2024 Executive Committee meeting be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Amy Griffin and approved unanimously by roll call vote.

Financial Reports & Project Update

Bryan David and Deborah Gosney presented the Financial Reports and Project Updates that were included in the meeting packet for the period ending December 31, 2024. Robert Bates made a motion that the Financial Reports be approved as presented; the motion was seconded by Keith Harkins and approved unanimously by roll call vote.

SPECIAL APPEARANCES & PRESENTATIONS

The Executive Director of the Southern Virginia Regional Alliance, Linda Green, presented an update on the Berry Hill Megasite including the recent announcement by Microporous to invest \$1.35 Billion creating over 2,000 jobs.

OLD BUSINESS

Project Pipeline

Bryan David reviewed the current project pipeline which was emailed to Council members prior to the meeting. The following projects were discussed:

- Institute for Advance Learning & Research (IALR) Virginia Controlled Environment Agriculture (CEA) Hub: This is an implementation project for the CEA Strategy & Roadmap.
- SOVA Innovation Labs- Digital Fabrication Lab: This is an expansion of the SOVA Innovation Hub and will offer a maker's space and co-working space in a campus style environment.
- Southside Virginia Community College Foundation: This project will fund the training equipment (tractor trailers), technology equipment, and classroom furniture for the spaces serving the Powerline and Truck Driver Training Programs.
- Region 3 Leadership Development Project: This project would be in partnership with the UVA Sorenson Institute for Leadership and the Virginia Institute for Government to develop a community leadership program in Region 3.

Chair Willis asked members for questions or comments; there being none, there was no discussion regarding the updates.

NEW BUSINESS

The Region 3 Council's membership will undergo a transition for the upcoming FY2025-2026 reappointment appointment cycle. The bylaws limit members to two consecutive four-year terms. There are five members whose term will end on 6.30.25 and who are not eligible for reappointment. Each of these members is a private-sector representative. Bryan David will work with the Region 3 Council Chair (Lauren Willis) and members of the Nominating Committee (Tim Clark, Randy Lail) to develop a succession plan. This plan will be presented to the Region 3 Council at its meeting on April 16th.

DHCD GO Virginia staff has recommended Region 3 to identify Logistics & Transportation as targeted traded sector in its Growth & Diversification Plan. This amendment would allow the Southside Virginia Community College project for truck driver training, currently under development, to be eligible for Per Capita funding. Melody Foster made a motion to approve the proposed amendment to the Region 3 Growth & Diversification Plan to include Transportation & Logistics as a targeted traded sector; the motion was seconded by Elizabeth Leggett and approved unanimously by roll call vote.

The Artificial Intelligence (AI) Statewide Assessment is a collaborative, multi-region planning project in partnership with the Virginia Chamber of Commerce and GOVA Region 2. GOVA funding will support a consultant to produce a comprehensive AI report to include a sector-specific analysis, current program catalog, along with strategic recommendations. This report will identify how AI will impact the workplace from a business perspective, which will be included in the Virginia Chamber of Commerce's Blueprint 2035 update. Only the GOVA State Board can approve this application under current policy; the earliest opportunity would be at its March 2025 meeting.

PROGRAM DIRECTOR'S REPORT

These minutes were approved on

Bryan David presented the Program Director's Report as detailed in the meeting packet. The topics discussed were the IALR Talent Pathway Initiative, exploring the feasibility of co-locating data centers and greenhouses, the status of the G&D Plan update, GOVA Regional Council Committee report, JLARC's report on data centers in Virginia, and the Tobacco Commission's Strategic Plan. There were no questions nor comments from the Council.

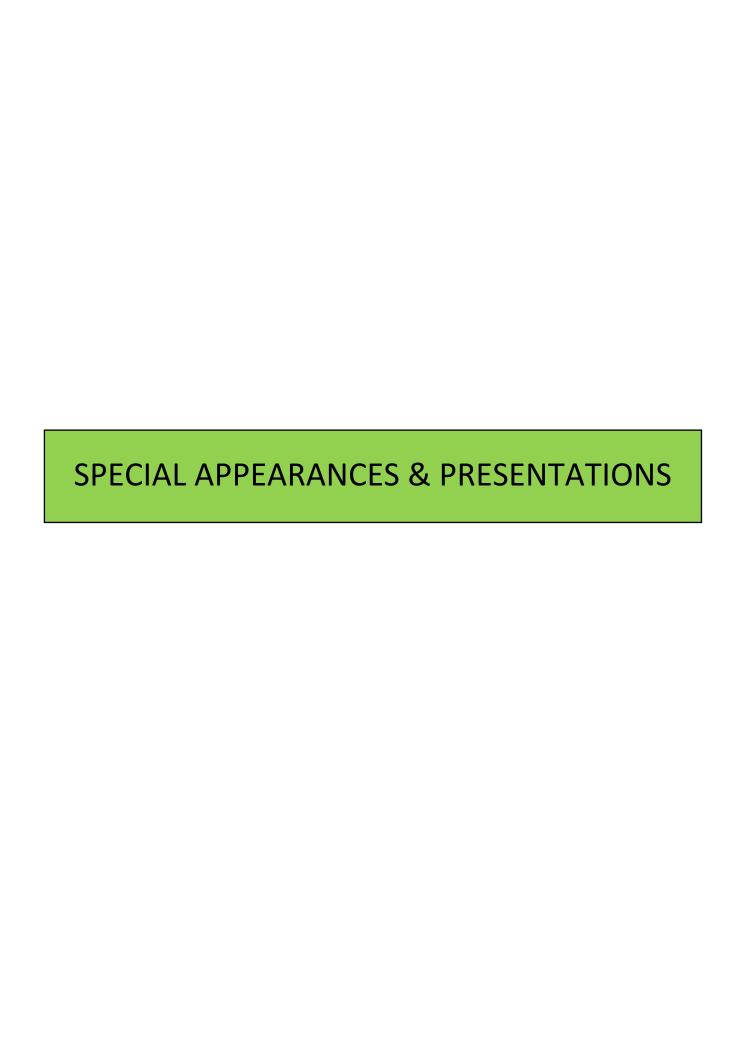

As you know, GO TEC Virginia 2025 is a multi-region GO Virginia Statewide Competitive grant that expands and scales the program to Region 1 (Southwest Virginia), Region 4 (Petersburg area), and Region 5 (Hampton Roads). IALR has accomplished this expansion through coordinating entities in each of these regions.

An element of this project involves how to best track GO TEC students academically from middle school through high school. Dr. Brown has engaged a team of subject matter experts to develop a system for GO TEC school divisions to use.

Dr. Julie Brown, Vice President of Advanced Learning, IALR, will provide a report on this tool at the April 16th meeting.

RE: Project Pipeline Report

Below is information about projects that are in varying stages of development:

I. SOVA Partnership Health Science Careers

-the Talent Pathways Initiative planning project is being completed by project principals with the Blue Ridge Partnership for Health Science Careers (C. Lawrence) and George Mason University (Dr. C. Sutter). Dr. Julie Brown (IALR) has provided inregion leadership and staffing support to the SOVA Partnership. This report will be presented to the Region 3 Council at its meeting on July 16th.

-initial discussions with Dr. Brown focus on a GO Virginia Region 3 Per Capita grant application being submitted for consideration by the Region 3 Council later this year. Potentially, the IALR would submit this application in partnership with the Region 3 healthcare systems (SOVA Health, Sentara, VCU Community Memorial Health, and Centra), the region's K-16 educational institutions, and other healthcare workforce development stakeholders.

-the grant would include funding for at least one (1) staff position to support the SOVA Partnership's work, data collection and analysis, and other workforce development-related support. Dr. Brown and IALR would manage and support the position.

- -development of a Per Capita application has not yet been initiated.
- -an estimate for a Per Capita grant request is to be determined.

II. Industrial Skilled Trades Training Program

-each of the community colleges in GO VA Region 3 (Patrick & Henry CC, Danville CC, and Southside Virginia CC) established a collaborative partnership in October 2024 to advance training and credentials in skilled trades. This partnership is being supported by a \$1MM grant from Chancellor Dore at the Virginia Community College System.

- -after discussing with Patrick & Henry Community College's leadership how the GO Virginia Region 3 Council could support the partnership, the college has begun exploring the feasibility of creating a workforce development training program for "industrial skilled trades." These trades would focus on supporting Region 3's targeted sectors. Initially identified trades include electrical, HVAC, carpentry, and plumbing/pipefitting.
- -a Per Capita application is in the early stages of development.
- -an estimate for a Per Capita grant request is under development.

III. CEA Innovation Center Research Building Expansion

- -Dr. Scott Lowman has indicated that the greenhouses currently used for contract research to CEA firms and other academic institutions are at capacity, creating a backlog of work. Contract research is an operating revenue source for the CEA Innovation Center.
- -the project would involve installing a prefabricated research greenhouse, making associated building improvements, and preparing the site and utilities.
- -companion grants from the US Economic Development Administration and Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission would be concurrently pursued to purchase the greenhouse and fund the associated site development and utilities.
- -a GO Virginia Region 3 Per Capita grant would be pursued for the equipment used in research at the greenhouse.
- -development of a Per Capita application has not yet been initiated.
- -an estimate for a Per Capita grant request is to be determined.

RE: GO Virginia Region 3 Nominating Committee Report

As previously communicated to the Region 3 Council, the Nominating Committee is developing a recommendation on current members who are interested and eligible for reappointment and for new members to be appointed to replace those current members who are no longer eligible for reappointment. These member reappointments and appointments will be finalized at the Region 3 Council meeting on July 16th.

The Region 3 Council meeting scheduled for April 16th is the annual organizational meeting as contemplated by the Region 3 Council bylaws. At this meeting, the Region 3 Council nominates and approves the Chair and Vice Chair for 2025-2026. These leadership positions are effective on July 1st.

The Region 3 Council bylaws specify that "...the council must be chaired by a citizen member from the region with significant private-sector business experience." It has been customary for the Vice Chair to have a similar experience.

In light of this requirement, the Nominating Committee developed a transition plan for the Chair and Vice Chair positions for 2025-2026. It was presented to the Region 3 Executive Committee at its meeting on March 16th, as follows:

- The current Chair (Lauren Willis) and Vice Chair (Randy Lail) will need to step down as Council members and from their Chair and Vice Chair roles effective July 1st because they are no longer eligible for reappointment. To ensure Region 3 Council leadership continuity, Lauren and Randy have expressed a willingness to remain as Chair and Vice Chair until June 30, 2026.
- This extension would allow time to assess current Region 3 Council members for private-sector individuals who may be interested and well-suited to move into leadership roles for the Region 3 Council. The bylaws allow members to serve until the council appoints a replacement.
- The Executive Committee recommends to the Region 3 Council that this leadership transition plan be approved by voting to approve Lauren Willis as Chair and Randy Lail as Vice Chair from July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026.

I understand that the other GO Virginia Region 3 Councils are undergoing similar transitions with founding members, and each has used appropriate and reasonable approaches to provide continuity for the organization because of these circumstances.

I have attached an updated roster for the Region 3 Council membership, which shows those members who are eligible or no longer eligible for reappointment. The Nominating Committee will contact council members eligible for reappointment to determine their interest in serving another four (4) year term.

The Nominating Committee will be prepared to discuss this matter with the Region 3 Council at its April 16th meeting.

The Project Review Committee met on Wednesday, April 9th, to review the following project applications:

I. Southside Virginia Occupational Training Facility Project (Southside Community College Foundation) – grants have been secured from the US Economic Development Administration (US EDA) and the Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission to construct a new classroom building at its Blackstone/Fort Barfoot location. The building will allow the expansion of the Powerline Worker and Truck Driver Training programs due to increasing student and business demands. Additionally, the US EDA grant funding will be used to expand the truck driving range.

A GO Virginia Region 3 Per Capita grant would be used to purchase classroom technology, furniture, and two (2) tractor-trailers.

II. SOVA Fab Lab at the SOVA Innovation Campus (SOVA Innovation Hub) - The proposed project will establish the SOVA Fab (fabrication) Lab at the SOVA Innovation Campus in downtown South Boston, Virginia. The SOVA Fab Lab will be a collaborative environment with advanced tools and technologies to foster creativity, innovation, and skill-building in digital fabrication, 3D printing, and design.

Under the guidance of the <u>Fab Foundation</u>, the SOVA Fab Lab will be designed to join the global Fab Lab Network, an open community of fabricators, scientists, engineers, and students who share a goal of democratizing access to tools for technical invention. The SOVA Fab Lab will utilize available templates for design and equipment procurement to help invent the next generation of manufacturing and digital fabrication skills.

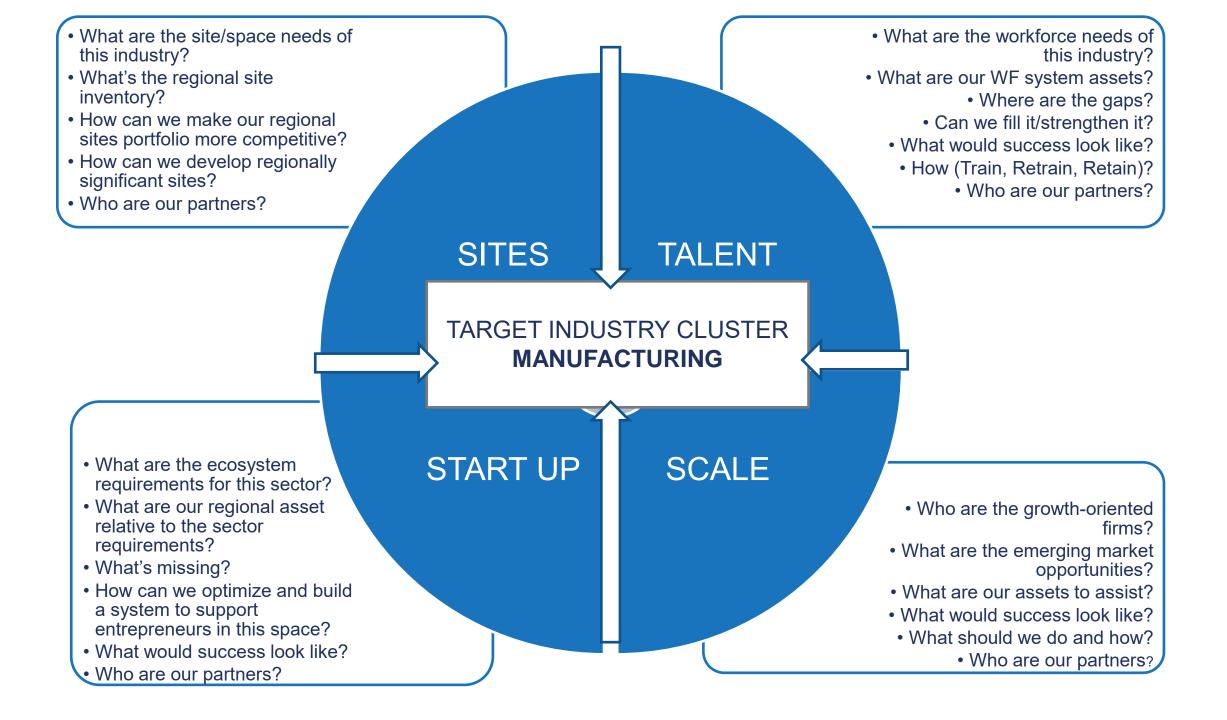

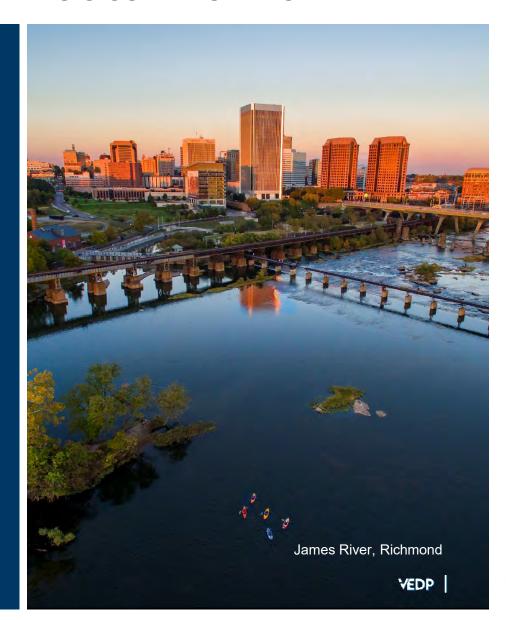
